REGULATIONS FOR THE ACCREDITATION AND ACCESS OF JOURNALISTS AT THE VENUE OF THE 15th INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF PROSPECTORS AND EXPLORERS - proEXPLO 2026

GENERAL PROVISIONS

Article 1. – These regulations are mandatory for all journalists attending the 15th International Congress of Prospectors and Explorers - proEXPLO 2026, to be held from May 4 to 6, 2026, at the *Centro de Exposiciones Jockey*.

Article 2. – The purpose of these regulations is to establish the conditions for registration and the performance of journalistic duties within the framework of proEXPLO 2026.

Article 3. – Journalists must carry out all coordination exclusively with the Communications Department of the Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP), which will be responsible for guidance, information, and coordination related to proEXPLO 2026. Journalists applying for accreditation must demonstrate that their primary activity is editorial journalism and not marketing, sales, or commercial content production.

They must also commit to covering the event through interviews, live updates, reports, or other content related to proEXPLO 2026.

PRESS ACCREDITATION PROCESS

Article 4. – Journalist registration shall be carried out electronically by completing the Press Accreditation Form, which must include contact information and media outlet details.

Article 5. – The Press Accreditation Form must be submitted no later than April 20, 2026. After this date, no new applications will be accepted, either by email or in person at the IIMP offices and/or the event venue.

Article 6. – Confirmation of accredited journalists will be sent exclusively by email from prensa@iimp.org.pe within five (5) business days after submission of contact and media information. The IIMP reserves the right to approve or deny accreditation requests submitted within the established deadline.

Article 7. – Accredited journalists shall have access to program activities and the exhibition area, subject to availability and venue capacity.

Article 8. – A maximum of two (2) credentials per media outlet will be granted for print, radio, or digital media, and three (3) credentials for television media.

CREDENTIALS

Article 9. – Accredited journalists may collect their credentials as follows:

- Location: proEXPLO 2026 Registration Desk at the *Centro de Exposiciones Jockey*.
- Date and Time: Monday, May 4; Tuesday, May 5; and Wednesday, May 6, from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
(Tentative schedule, subject to confirmation)
- Journalists who do not collect their credentials during the indicated dates and times may present their confirmation email at the venue to obtain them. No on-site registration will be available during the event.

Article 10. – All accredited journalists must wear their credentials visibly at all times. Credentials are mandatory, personal, and non-transferable. They constitute the sole authorization for access to conference rooms and the exhibition fair.

Article 11. – In case of loss, replacement of a credential will incur a fee of US\$50.00.

COVERAGE AND BROADCASTING

Article 12. – Journalists who require the installation of equipment for live or recorded broadcasts must notify prensa@iimp.org.pe in advance in order to arrange the necessary coordination.

Article 13. – Access to the press room, conference rooms, and other activities shall be limited to designated press areas, maintaining order and respecting capacity limits..

DISTRIBUTION AND/OR DISPLAY OF ADVERTISING MATERIAL

Article 14. – The distribution and/or display of unauthorized advertising material is strictly prohibited at venue entrances, areas adjacent to the administrative offices, conference rooms, food courts, and exhibition zones.

ACCESS CONTROL AND PERMANENCE

Article 15. – Journalists shall receive ongoing support and assistance from the Communications Department of the Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP) throughout the event.

Article 16. – If an invalid credential or one not corresponding to the journalist is detected, it shall be confiscated and access to the venue will be immediately denied.

Article 17. – Journalists who fail to comply with these regulations or established codes of conduct shall receive a warning from event organizers. If such behavior persists, they shall be escorted out by security personnel, their credentials shall be retained, and re-entry shall be prohibited.



RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PERUVIAN INSTITUTE OF MINING ENGINEERS

Article 18. – The Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP) shall not be held liable for non-compliance resulting from unforeseen circumstances or force majeure. For these purposes, unforeseen circumstances or force majeure shall be understood as non-attributable causes consisting of extraordinary, unforeseeable, and unavoidable events that prevent the performance of obligations or result in their partial, delayed, or defective fulfillment.

Such events include, but are not limited to, fires, earthquakes, tsunamis, landslides, avalanches, floods, torrential rains, storms, explosions, armed conflicts or internal or external wars, civil disturbances, blockades, acts of terrorism and sabotage, uncontrollable transportation delays, strikes and work stoppages, as well as any other similar or dissimilar causes. It is understood that this list is merely illustrative and not exhaustive; therefore, all events beyond the reasonable control of the parties that could not have been foreseen, or that, even if foreseeable, could not have been prevented, shall be included, as well as any loss of or damage to equipment, tools, and materials.

Article 19. The Peruvian Institute of Mining Engineers (IIMP) reserves the right to unilaterally modify event dates. In such cases, journalists shall not be entitled to claim any form of compensation or indemnification.
